Rulemaking Overview

Ecology is formally proposing a new chapter of rule, Chapter 173-187 WAC -Financial Responsibility.

Financial Responsibility ensures vessel and facility owners and operators have adequate financial resources to pay cleanup costs and damages resulting from oil spills.



Why are we conducting this rulemaking?

Engrossed Second Substitute House Bill (E2SHB) 1691, codified in Chapter 88.40 RCW, directs Ecology to adopt rules regarding financial responsibility requirements for oil handling facilities and vessels.

Intent.

The legislature recognizes that oil and hazardous substance spills and other forms of incremental pollution present serious danger to the fragile marine environment of Washington state. It is the intent and purpose of this chapter to define and prescribe financial responsibility requirements for vessels that transport petroleum products as cargo or as fuel across the waters of the state of Washington and for facilities that store, handle, or transfer oil or hazardous substances in bulk on or near the navigable waters.

Rulemaking Scope

The new rule will:

Define the entities subject to requirements.

Establish required financial responsibility levels for oil handling facilities and pipelines.

Specify the procedures and timelines for obtaining or renewing a certificate of financial responsibility (COFR).

Establish requirements for acceptable evidence of financial responsibility, including self-insurance.



Scope Continued

Outline process for timely updates to changes in regulated industry financial status.

Define processes governing the suspension, revocation, and re-issuance of certificates of financial responsibility

Incorporate/update financial responsibility requirements currently included in WAC Chapter 317-50 – Financial Responsibility for Small Tank Barges and Oil Spill Response Barges

Repeal Chapter 317-50 WAC




Alternative Financial Responsibility Calculation

Facilities may request an alternative financial responsibility calculation

Requirements:

- In writing
- application
- ullet



May reduce the amount of financial responsibility they will be required to prove



Submission = at least 65 days before COFR

Describe ability to pay for a worst-case spill and prevention and preparedness efforts Subject to a 30 day public review



Financial **Responsibility** – Certification Process

Ecology will verify Protection & Indemnity (P&I) club membership for arriving vessels.

Enrolled in P&I club? Yes \rightarrow no COFR action required

Regulated facilities \rightarrow submit an application for COFR

Scenario with multiple facilities or vessels? Owners/operators can: • obtain 1 certificate to cover all their facilities

- or vessels
- of their facilities or vessels

No \rightarrow submit an application for WA COFR

obtain multiple certificates to cover a subset



Methods of Proving Financial Responsibility

- Evidence of insurance
- Surety bonds
- Guarantee
- Letter of credit
- Certificates of deposit
- Protection and indemnity club membership
- Certificate of financial responsibility from another state or from the federal government
- Self-Insurance
- Other evidence of financial responsibility deemed acceptable by ecology




Compliance Timelines

COFR:

- Class 1 facilities \rightarrow 9 months
- Vessels \rightarrow 21 months

After the effective date of the rule,

The timeline to submit a request for a COFR is: Class 1, 2, and 3 facilities \rightarrow 65 days before beginning operations in WA • Vessels \rightarrow at least 10 calendar days before entering the WA waters*



Phase-in timeline to submit request for initial

• Class 2 and 3 facilities \rightarrow 15 months



Compliance Timelines

Certificates expire 2 years after issuance

The proposed rule also specifies a timeline for COFR renewal.

Must submit an application to renew between 30 and 90 calendar days before the expiration date.






Notification Requirements

- Significant changes relevant to a vessel or facility's COFR must be reported to Ecology within 7 days. Changes include but are not limited to:
 - Change in ownership or operational control.
 - If method of demonstrating FR is to be terminated or any coverage is to cease.
 - If any FR coverage amount will be changed/adjusted.
- A large spill that may impact the ability to prove financial responsibility must be reported within 10 days

Adoption Phase




